

ARE CORE MEMORIES REAL

ORIGINS OF THE CORE MEMORY CONCEPT

TYPES OF MEMORY RELEVANT TO CORE MEMORIES

EMOTIONAL SIGNIFICANCE AND MEMORY RETENTION

EMOTIONAL INTENSITY IS A KEY FACTOR THAT ENHANCES MEMORY RETENTION AND RECALL. RESEARCH SHOWS THAT MEMORIES ASSOCIATED WITH STRONG EMOTIONS ARE MORE LIKELY TO BE PRESERVED WITH GREATER CLARITY. FACTORS INFLUENCING EMOTIONAL MEMORY STRENGTH

- THE INTENSITY OF THE EMOTIONAL EXPERIENCE
