DEFINITION AND EXPLANATION OF SENSITIZATION IN PSYCHOLOGY

NEURAL PLASTICITY

REPEATED EXPOSURE TO A STIMULUS CAN INDUCE LONG-TERM POTENTIATION (LTP), A PROCESS THAT STRENGTHENS SYNAPTIC CONNECTIONS AND FACILITATES MORE ROBUST RESPONSES. PHYSIOLOGICAL RESPONSES

HUMAN BEHAVIOR

IN HUMANS, SENSITIZATION MANIFESTS IN VARIOUS WAYS INCLUDING INCREASED ANXIETY OR FEAR RESPONSES FOLLOWING REPEATED EXPOSURE TO TRAUMATIC OR STRESSFUL EVENTS. FOR INSTANCE, INDIVIDUALS MAY DEVELOP HEIGHTENED SENSITIVITY TO LOUD NOISES OR SPECIFIC ENVIRONMENTAL TRIGGERS AFTER EXPERIENCING TRAUMA.
